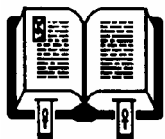


**TODAY IS THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Dear Parishioners,

Lorenzo di'Medici (a.k.a. "The Magnificent") lived a somewhat morally lax life, but nonetheless, well understood the importance and dignity of the Sacraments. When a priest was sent to his deathbed to give him Viaticum, he refused, saying that he was unworthy to have God come to him. Instead, he rose, dressed himself, and was led to a hall where he prostrated himself before the Blessed Sacrament before receiving his last Holy Communion. This touching act of piety is a fitting reminder of the great privilege we have in being able to adore and receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. St. Gemma Galgani wrote in her diary, "Yesterday as I drew near to Jesus exposed in the Blessed Sacrament, I felt myself burning all over; it rose even to my face. Viva Gesu! How happens it that so many who are standing close to Jesus do not burn to ashes?" Routine can erode the appropriate sense of awe and gratitude due to Jesus, so this Solemnity of Corpus Christi is a time to renew our appreciation of the great gift always present among us in the tabernacle. As St. John Chrysostom once spoke to his own flock, "When you are before the altar where Christ reposes, you ought no longer to think that you are among men, but believe that there are troops of angels and archangels standing by you, and trembling with respect before the sovereign Master of heaven and earth. Therefore, when you are in Church, be there in silence, fear and veneration."
